HORNET High-5s are digital. Check your inbox throughout this semester for possible #HH5 emails celebrating students "caught doing good." We will also continue to implement our "strike" system at KMS. This program is non-disciplinary but helps students correct poor behaviors or choices. The "Strike" system also helps us to better inform parents of poor student behaviors while working with students to remediate these behaviors before they become more severe or frequent. Both of these programs hope to create better lines of communication between students, staff, and parents and help celebrate or correct behaviors through open and honest discussions.

KMS Homework Tracker...

- ...is where teachers are regularly updating homework assignments and due dates for upcoming projects, tests, and quizzes.
- ...is a tool to help parents and students more effectively keep track of work on a nightly/weekly basis
- ...is **NOT** a replacement for student accountability or the end-all-be-all in what is required of students. Students **SHOULD BE** encouraged to keep track of their individual assignments and requirements as expectations can and will change at times for their class
- ...does allow you to look back over time (as previous weeks have been archived for your convenience)

Race Overview: This is a Chip Timed 5K running through the City of Faith and Beauty, Kirtland, OH. There is a registration fee of \$10 for all runners and includes a chip timed bib, one water stop, and finisher medal. A 1 mile fun walk is also available and costs \$5 for a race bib. T-shirts are available for purchase separately on the registration website, as well as a limited supply for sale on race day, for \$12 each, youth and adult sizes available. Online registration is recommended. Race day registration opens at 7 am.

Course Overview: The Kirtland Heritage Run had its beginnings in 1984 as part of the Kiwanis Heritage Days, now the Strawberry Festival. Kirtland, OH is nestled in Lake County and is known for its rich history and incredible landscape.

This 5K course begins and ends at Kirtland City Hall and winds past the Historic Kirtland Temple, Historic Kirtland Village, and the surrounding neighborhoods, and includes a challenging hill.

It's back...ESCWR Summer Sidekicks Program! This academic summer program serves students entering into grades 1st-8th .

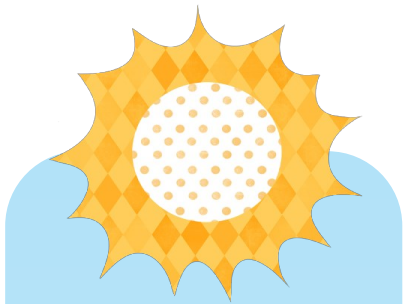
Students will focus on math & literacy lessons that are educational, interactive and fun while addressing *unfinished learning*.

- Every participant gets a free book to take home, prizes, snacks, & pizza party on the last session!

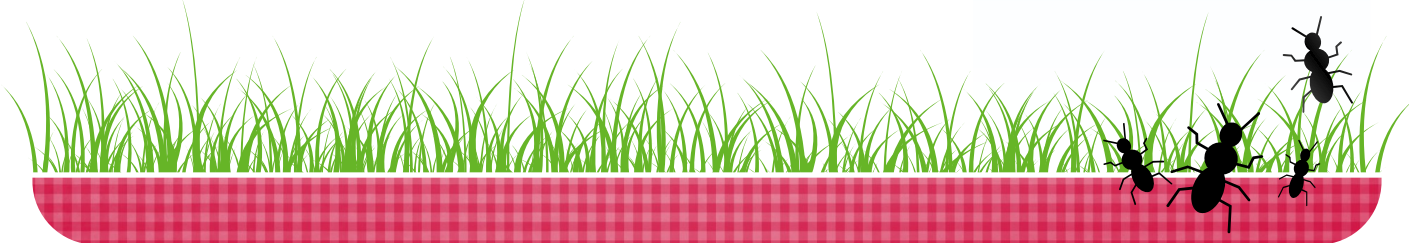

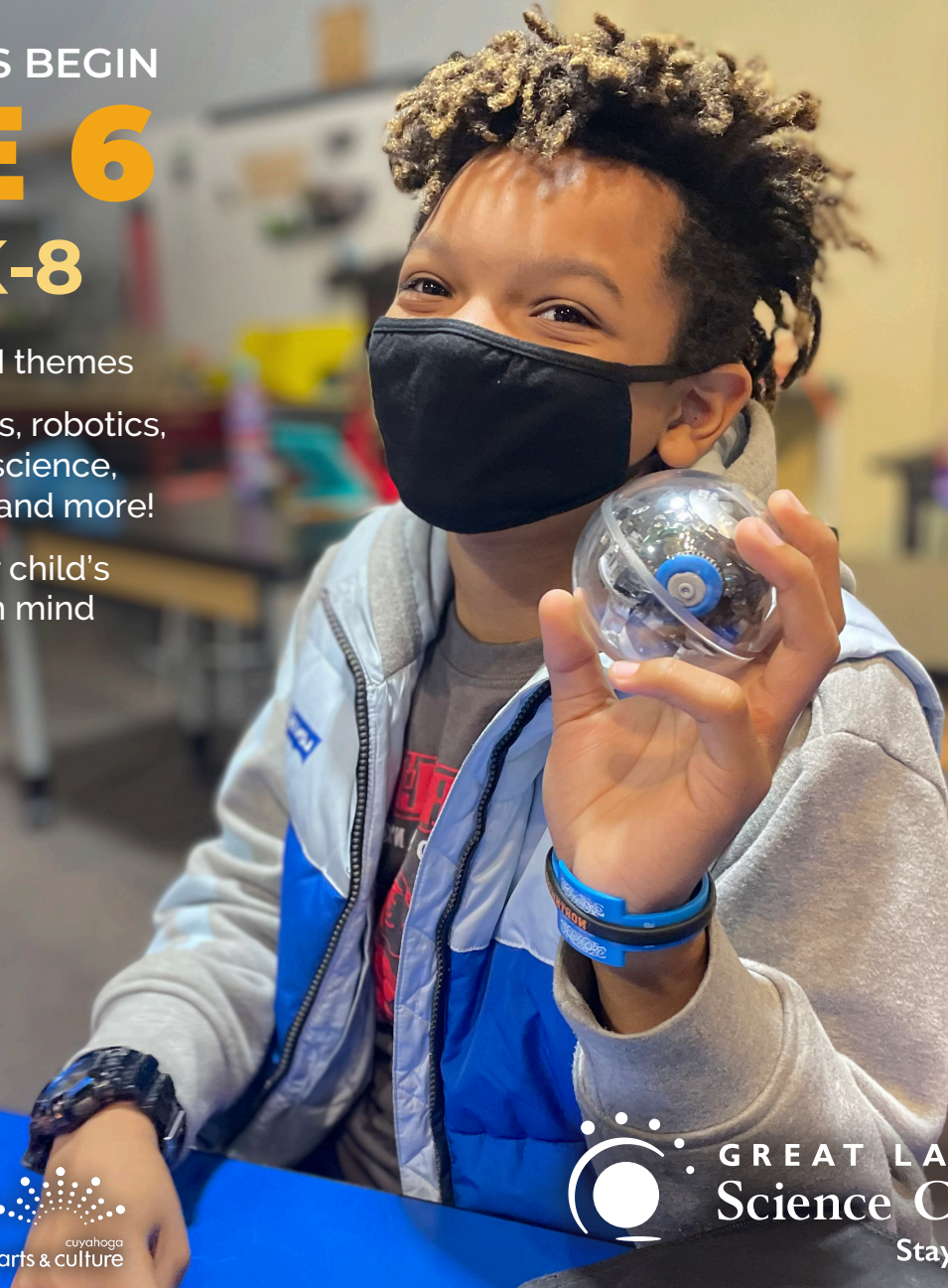

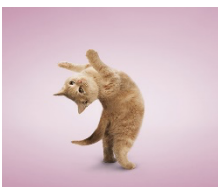
